Short Title: Clarify existing Agency Liquor Store Laws

1. Purpose:

Align Title 16 (Section 16-2-201 and 16-3-307) with 1995 legislation that privatized the remaining liquor stores. Remove references that the department of revenue operates liquor stores and sells liquor to licensees and clarify that because agency stores authorized in the 1995 legislation have different commission rates, while the posted price remains the same, the amount paid by the licensee may be different.

2. Background:

In 1995, the remaining liquor stores were privatized. Many of the sections within Title 16 were amended; however, two of the sections were not aligned with the other sections of the law to acknowledge the state no longer operates the liquor stores and does not sell directly to licensees.
