



2017 Alcohol Education Summit Awards Nomination Form

SECTION 1 – NOMINATION CATEGORIES – Please choose only one category for your nominee.

- Outstanding Community Program of the Year:** This award recognizes a community program that has helped to change the drinking culture in their community. The program must have a specific focus on reducing alcohol abuse in the community whether through reducing drinking and driving, binge drinking, youth access to alcohol, encouraging licensed liquor establishments to use responsible sales and service practices to prevent over-service to patrons or by helping to change the perception of risk of adults providing alcohol to youth.
- Volunteer of the Year:** This award recognizes individuals for their volunteer services relating to the reduction of alcohol abuse in their community. Service must be in relation to working directly in their community either through their own efforts, a community coalition, service organization or city/county/state government entity. This is a person who makes significant contributions to their community through their time, actions and dedication. The activities, events or service listed on the application cannot be part of the nominee's job description or duties.
- Law Enforcement Office of the Year:** This award recognizes a state trooper, officer or deputy in good standing with their agency, who has made a significant contribution to reducing DUIs on our roadways and/or enforcing over-service violations. The nomination should demonstrate the exemplary service and describe what distinguishes this nominee's efforts from those of other law enforcement personnel. The letter of support for this category must be from the nominee's Chief/Sheriff/Commander and must provide specific examples and statistics of how the officer has excelled beyond the call of duty.
- Prevention Specialist of the Year:** This award recognizes people in health related fields that have made a substantial change in environmental prevention within their community. Their efforts must have helped to change the norms or attitudes of the people in their community regarding the abuse of alcohol. Nomination should demonstrate the nominee's efforts that have increased awareness of alcohol related issues; promoted the idea that high risk and illegal use of alcohol is not acceptable in the community; created new collaborations between community members, business and their local government.
- Trainer of the Year:** This award recognizes a Let's Control It trainer who has a true concern for and commitment to educating servers/sellers/licenseses on responsible sales and service practices. This trainer has outstanding professionalism and presentation skills, has the ability to relate to the subject matter and emphasize the importance of not over-serving patrons, has helped licensees to draft house policies, actively reaches out to licensees to provide training, has developed positive relationships with licensees and their employees and has worked to ensure that community events are safe and responsible.
- DUI Task Force of the Year:** This award recognizes a DUI Task Force that has demonstrated excellence in education, impaired driving enforcement and reduction of alcohol abuse. This DUI Task Force has been successful in reducing the number of crashes, fatalities and injuries on our highways, and has excelled in many areas which might include but are not limited to DUI arrest, deterrence of over-service and underage drinking prevention.
- Community Coalition of the Year:** This award recognizes a community coalition that has had great success at bringing partners together to become involved in efforts to reduce alcohol abuse within their community. The coalition's commitment and focus must be on the prevention of alcohol abuse. Coalition membership should consist of a broad range of members. Nomination should include a list of all community partners and key stakeholders and identify the geographical area in which the coalition focuses their efforts and include the coalition's sustainability within the community.
- Outstanding Service:** This award recognizes any individual or entity that has made a significant effort to change the drinking culture in their community or state. This could be by proposing specific legislation or local ordinance directly related to alcohol abuse, conducting community scans and addressing alcohol related issues, working directly in any facet whether education, prevention, treatment or enforcement, etc.
