

RUGBY UNION CLUB HOUSE MANAGEMENT PLAN

1. The Management and Staff of Rugby Union Club will ensure the responsible service of alcohol at all times in accordance with the Liquor Licensing Amendment Act 1998 of WA and the Registered Club Act,
2. Rugby Union Club has a policy to serve patrons in a responsible, friendly and professional manner. The Staff are on hand to assist patrons in their decision to drink in moderation and where appropriate, avoid the dilemmas of combining drinking and driving.
3. Through this policy, a framework and strategies have been formed, addressing the following issues.
 - House Policy provides the framework for the Responsible Serving of Alcohol.
 - Training of Staff so that they may implement and promote the house policy and to receive information in this regards or to attend courses to this effect and to update staff regularly in any changes to the policy.
 - Education of Patrons so they can understand the implication of and abide by the Responsible Serving of Alcohol. Promotion of house policy will appear in newsletters, websites and within the Club walls.
 - Safe transport and a free phone call to a taxi service.
 - Strategies for the elimination of under-age drinking.
4. The Rugby Union Club will affect these five strategies by:
 - Implementation, monitoring and modification of the Club's House Policy, on an on-going basis.
 - Implementation and adherence of the Barpersohs Responsible Service of Alcohol Procedure.
 - Implementation and adherence of the Code Of Conduct for Bar Staff
 - Organising and facilitating education and training sessions of bar staff and committee through WA Police.
 - Preventing under-age drinking by insisting on valid and recognised identification on entry and at any time upon request.
 - Promotion, sale and service of low and non-alcoholic beverages.
 - Supporting safe transportation options.
 - Displaying the club policy, mission statement and Code of Conduct in a prominent place.
5. The Rugby Union Club evacuation policy to be displayed in a prominent position, on the Club website and communicated to the members.
