Label and Product Approval Requirements



Guide for licensed/registered alcoholic beverage manufacturers/importers.

All Manufacturers:

- Some product labels require a Certificate of Label Approval/Exemption (COLA) for products regulated by the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau (TTB). Any change to the label that requires approval or exemption from the TTB <u>must be</u> <u>approved</u> by Alcoholic Beverage Control Division (ABCD) <u>prior</u> to the product entering the Montana market.
- All required alcoholic beverage labels, along with the picture of the label, and primary
 packaging (unless a traditional container is used), <u>must be submitted</u> to ABCD <u>prior</u> to
 shipping or selling alcoholic beverage products in Montana.
- When online label submissions are required through our TransAction Portal (TAP) at http://tap.dormt.gov, the limit is a maximum of 10 labels per online submission.
- Manufacturer licensees may produce alcoholic beverage products for a business. The
 manufacturer's name must be visible on the label, tap handle, menu, bar glasses,
 napkins, etc., and may not be misleading as to who has produced the product.
 Acceptable examples: "Betty's BBQ Pale Ale brewed by Best Brewery Company," or
 "Distilled for Betty's BBQ by D.R. Distillery", etc.

Breweries:

- Each product an out-of-state brewer or beer importer desires to sell in Montana must have the product label approved by ABCD.
- Label submissions are required online through TAP.
- Breweries licensed in Montana with an annual nationwide production of less than 10,000 barrels are exempt from ABCD label approval unless the beer's ABV is more than 8.75% alcohol by volume (ABV) but not more than 14% ABV.
 - Beer over 8.75% ABV may be considered liquor, depending on how the beer is produced, and beer over 14% ABV is considered liquor in Montana and must follow the distilled spirits labeling instructions.
- COLAs are not required with labels when the product is sold within Montana.
- Breweries participating in a collaborated brewed beer product:
 - All breweries must submit label approvals of the collaborated beer if the ABV is over 8.75% and if they want to take the product to their licensed premises and serve it in their sample room or licensed retail area.
- Beer label submission(s) must be submitted online through the TransAction Portal (<u>TAP</u>).
 - Log into your TAP account.
 - Select "brewery license."
 - Select "more."
 - Choose liquor labels and select "request label approvals."
- Beer label requirements:
 - o COLA TTB label approval/exemption (if applicable).

Label and Product Approval Requirements



- Picture of the product's primary packaging:
 - Must be marketed responsibly and appropriately only to consumers aged 21 and older.
 - May not blur the distinction between alcoholic and nonalcoholic products by utilizing labeling and/or primary packaging emphasizing features most commonly associated with nonalcoholic consumable products.
- <u>Do not</u> sell or ship product(s) into the state of Montana without ABCD product and label approval.

Distilleries:

- ABCD must approve every product a distillery wishes to sell in Montana before shipping and/or selling the product.
- Email required paperwork for product approval:
 - o W-9 Form (available at MTRevenue.gov).
 - o Proof Gallon Form (available at MTRevenue.gov).
 - o Standardized Price Quotation Form (available at MTRevenue.gov).
 - o COLA TTB label approval/exemption (or, in some cases, label exemption).
 - Picture of the product's primary packaging:
 - Must be marketed responsibly and appropriately only to consumers aged 21 and older.
 - Cannot blur the distinction between alcoholic and nonalcoholic products by utilizing labeling and/or primary packaging emphasizing features most commonly associated with nonalcoholic consumable products.
- <u>Do not</u> sell or ship products without ABCD approval.

Wineries:

- Every product a winery or wine importer desires to sell in Montana, regardless of the ABV, <u>must be approved</u> by ABCD.
- A COLA from the TTB for wine with 7% ABV is required with the label submission.
 - Wine over 24% ABV is considered liquor in Montana and must follow the distilled spirits labeling instructions.
- Table wine label submission(s) <u>must be submitted</u> online through the TransAction Portal (TAP).
 - Log into your TAP account.
 - Select "winery license."
 - Select "more."
 - o Choose liquor labels and select "request label approvals."
- Wine 7% ABV
 - A Certificate of Label Approval/Exemption (COLA) from the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau (TTB) is required with the label submission
- Wine *over* 16% ABV:
 - o Labeling must go through the ABCD Distribution Bureau.
- Wine **over** 24% ABV is considered liquor in Montana.

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- ABCD Distribution Bureau must be contacted, and you must follow the distilled spirits labeling instructions.
- Wine label requirements:
 - COLA TTB label approval/exemption (if applicable).
 - o **REQUIRED**: Picture of the product's primary packaging:
 - Must be marked responsibly and appropriately only to consumers aged 21 and older.
 - May not blur the distinction between alcoholic and nonalcoholic products by utilizing labeling and/or primary packaging that emphasizes features most commonly associated with nonalcoholic consumable products.
- <u>Do not</u> sell or ship products without ABCD approval.

All licensees must comply with all Federal and Montana alcoholic beverage laws and rules.
